


Labour Will Take Over Government in General Election—Sir Randol (Excerpt)

“Government is the servant of the people and not their master,” stated Sir Randol Fawkes, leader of the Labour Party, on Wednesday as he announced that in the upcoming general elections his party will take over the government.

He said that both parties, the Free National Movement and the Progressive Liberal Party have turned the policy around. “If you find your

servant talking or not doing a job, you can fire them, but the government has ruled with such a heavy hand they now want to say that they are the masters and we are the servants,” Sir Randol said. “The true philosophy is that the people are the masters and if the government doesn’t do our wish, we have a right to dismiss them.”

Before reading a press statement, he said that Labour has always come to the aid of the country when there was a crisis.

Beginning the statement, he said that this was the moment of “truth in the political, economic and cultural life of our country.” It was twenty years ago when the Labour Party “had placed the Progressive Liberal Party in power after the Prime Minister, the Right Honourable Sir Linden Pindling, had privately and publicly promised “government with integrity.”

There has been a decay in public honesty, he said and this ranges from “cheap, petty dishonesty to monstrous crimes of betrayal of the very foundations of good government.”

He said that large sections of the public are threatened because they wish to speak the truth instead of falsities.

Sir Randol said the Labour Party chooses to take this opportunity make a change.

“The time has passed when the people can be fooled by childish and dishonest falsehoods,” he said. “The Labour Party was and is the only party that has not been corrupted over the years.

“The young men and women are looking to the Labour Party for the hope of a better life, Their fathers and mothers share their hopes.”

He said the party pledges to support the cause of a democratic government and the Christian way of life, support equality before the law for all men and women and mount resolute opposition to all forms of dictatorship and interference with human rights and human liberties.
